School Council

Introduction:

The School Councils play a very important role in helping to improve the school. From September 2011 changes have been made to how the council functions. Regular meetings will be held to ensure that improvements are made and that all pupils in school are involved.

Elections:

Two new class council representatives from each class will be elected. Pupils that would like to be considered for class councillor need to write and give a speech to their class explaining why they want to be a councillor and what they would like to achieve. Each class will then vote for their choices.

Councillors:

Each class will have councillors to represent their views at the two council meetings. They will be expected to attend every meeting.

School Council Board:

The board outside Mrs Kenny's office will be designated as a School Council Board. This board will contain pictures of each form's class representatives, minutes of the last school meeting and dates of forthcoming meetings. A suggestion box that is fixed to the wall will be positioned under the board. This box is for people to put sensible suggestions in, with ideas that may help us to improve the school; it will be emptied before each school council meeting. Suggestions will then be discussed by the school council to see if the ideas are achievable. The suggestion box is perfect for those who are shy to put ideas forward discretely.

Minutes:

At each meeting, minutes will be taken. A folder will be given to the representatives of each class. This folder will store all of the minutes from every meeting. The representatives have a very important job because they will have to report the minutes back to their class, so that everyone knows what has happened in the meetings. It also gives the class a chance to suggest more ideas ready for the next meeting. The minutes will be posted on the school council board and a copy sent to Sister Francis. The Chairperson will meet with the Head teacher to discuss the minutes. S/He will then feedback his/her responses in the next school council meeting.

The school council meetings will be announced in assembly but will also be displayed on the school council board. Hopefully, by using this method, everyone's ideas will be listened to and it will be possible to put them into practice.
