## Half Term Holiday Challenge

An environmental project worker attached to Swaffham Green Britain Centre has approached us to collaborate with them on Swaffham in Bloom Celebration at the end of term. They wish to decorate the trees in town with creative environmental textile work and asked if our students would create interesting prototypes during the half term break. Anything organic like flowers, insects, butterflies, dream catches using material, string, wool, raffia etc. the item must be waterproof. The lady was very impressed with the diversity of the eggs on display for the Easter holiday challenge and thought the children's work would be inspirational.
