### The Norfolk Children and Young People's Health and Wellbeing Survey 2017

In October pupils in years 5 to 11 took part in the Norfolk Children and Young People's Health and Wellbeing Survey. Our results have been compiled and compared to the Norfolk statistics. As a school we are very proud of the results and extremely pleased that our pupil's results are significantly more positive compared to Norfolk across the broad spectrum of questions. As with everything there is always room for improvement and although our statistics are on the whole better than Norfolk we will constantly strive to improve the emotional health and wellbeing of all of our pupils. We would like to share a few of our most promising statistics: 86% of pupils enjoy 'all' or 'most' of their lessons. 92% of pupils said 'I get the help I need from teachers and other adults at school'. 100% of the pupils agreed with the statement 'My work is marked so I can see how to improve it' 92% of pupils responded that they 'usually' or 'always' get along well with parents or carers. 75% find lessons on emotional health and wellbeing 'useful'.


